What did you like best about MID?

"The best thing about the MID program was that it pushed me to explore other departments within my company. I've worked in Sales at Puffer for 13 years, but through the MID curriculum, I was exposed to new areas such as Operations, Accounting, IT, and the Executive Suite. This gave me the opportunity to engage with colleagues and management which I otherwise would not have had access to and helped me grow within my company."

Were you able to implement any knowledge at work immediately?

"Yes! As a result of the MID program, I have learned to think more strategically. I have applied this thinking to the way I approach my customers and my business by integrating the needs of the customers with the best interests of my company."

From the time you heard about the MID program, how long did it take you to decide to apply?

"I had been contemplating pursuing my master's degree for 3 years. Once I finally decided on the MID program, it took me 3-4 months to apply."
